

### "Wide landscape"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority (A) Aperture: f/11 Flash: Off 200

Tips: Use a wide angle lens or zoom all the way out to include more of the scene. Set a higher f number to make sure the scene is in focus.



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# Get that shot!

## "Milky Water"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Manual (M) **Shutter Speed:** 1 sec or longer **Aperture:** f/16 ISO: 100 Tips: Use a tripod or small beanbag to steady your camera for this shot. Use a shutter release cable or the self timer to trigger the shutter. Pressing the shutter

with your finger will make the picture blurry.



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# Get that shot!

## "Eyeball"

Start with these settings:

Aperture Priority (A) **Exposure Mode:** Aperture: f/5.6 Flash: Off ISO: 200

Tips: Use Macro mode or a Macro lens to get really close. Position your subject facing a window for beautiful light.

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# Get that shot!

## "Portrait with bright background"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority (A) **Aperture:** f/11 Flash: Fill Flash On ISO: 100

Tips: Use Fill-Flash to throw light on your subject. Try making the flash less obvious by decreasing the flash power in camera settings.



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## Get that shot!



### "Window light portrait"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority (A) **Aperture:** f/4 **Flash:** Off **ISO:** 400

Tips: Don't go much lower than f/4 because focus will become difficult. Raise the ISO if camera blur is a problem.



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# Get that shot!



### "Stop Action"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Shutter Priority (S) **Shutter Speed:** 1/1000 **Flash:** Off **ISO:** 400

Tips: Try using manual focus or focus lock to "pre-focus" on the spot where your subject will be.



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# Get that shot!



#### "Silhouette"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority (A) **Aperture:** f/8 **Flash:** Off **ISO:** 100

Tips: Place your subject in front of a bright light. Meter for the light, not the subject. Use AEL to lock exposure.



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## Get that shot!



### "Panning"

Start with these settings:

 Exposure Mode: Shutter Priority (S)
Shutter Speed: 1/30
Flash: Off
ISO: 400

Tips: Move your camera smoothly keeping the subject in the viewfinder. Use continuous focus mode.



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#### "Bokeh"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority (A) **Aperture:** f/2.8 **Flash:** Off **ISO:** 100

Tips: Achieve a beautiful blurred background using a low F number. Focus on your subject's eyes.



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# Get that shot!

#### "Macro"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority (A) **Aperture:** f/11 **Flash:** Off **ISO:** 200

Tips: Use your camera's macro mode or a special macro lens to focus up close. Try shooting outdoors on a bright day.



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# Get that shot!

#### "Food"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Aperture Priority **Aperture:** f/8 **Flash:** Off **ISO:** 400

Tips: Use raw food as side props. Light your subject from behind or with window light. Mist salads with water.



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# Get that shot!

## "Time lapse"

Start with these settings:

Exposure Mode: Shutter Priority (S)
Shutter Speed: 2 sec or longer
Flash: Off
ISO: 100

Tips: Use a slow shutter speed and a tripod to catch light trails. Try shooting right after sunset to get some ambient light in the picture.

#### "Sunset"

Start with these settings:

Aperture Priority (A) **Exposure Mode:** Aperture: Flash: Off 200 ISO:

Tips: Include interesting elements in your picture like the tree below. Use a tripod as the light gets dim.

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# Get that shot!



### "Landscape"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode: Aperture Priority** Aperture: f/16 Off Flash: ISO: 100

Tips: Use a tripod and cable release. Compose so there is something interesting in the foreground, middle, and background. Shoot during the golden hours.



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# Get that shot!



### "Lightning"

Start with these settings:

**Exposure Mode:** Manual Mode (M) Aperture: f/11 **Shutter Speed:** 30 seconds 200

Tips: Shoot from a safe location! Continuously fire 30 second exposures to have a chance of catching lightning.
